WARNING: FRAUDULENT PRACTICUMS

Currently we have certified over 800 soldiers in the Basic MEMS course of study, and the process to complete this REQUIRED certification is relatively simple:

- 1) Complete two applications / One each to SGAUS and the MEMS Academy.
- 2) Complete the basic FEMA courses. (Most can be completed in a few hours.)
- 3) Complete your Practicum. THIS is the focus of this weeks article:

The Practicum is the only indicator allowed to prove you have completed the FEMA courses AND you are putting that knowledge to work at an Emergency Operation exercise, with full understanding of your role and the functionality of emergency management as defined by FEMA. (First responders were most likely deployed to an Incident Command Post, and are allowed to write a Practicum based on experience.)

In the past, individuals have tried to commit fraud by circumventing the Practicum process. They submitted copied/plagiarized/reused Practicums from another soldier. Due to the fact MEMS certification is mandatory for promotion, as issued by our Commanding General, cheating on any part of the promotion process is deemed to be misconduct, and open for disciplinary actions.

As far as the CSMR is involved, this will NOT be tolerated, and will result in:

Immediate dismissal from the MEMS Academy, and possible charges being filed resulting in dismissal from the California State Military Reserves.

Your CA MEMS Team has reviewed the Practicum process and is allowing CSMR soldiers the option of attending an Emergency Management Exercise as an "in-service class". (The next is scheduled for the first week in November 2014.)

This two day class includes a "Practicum Test" at the conclusion of day two, and this test will count as your Practicum. All efforts have been made to accommodate CSMR soldiers needs to fulfill their Practicum requirements. Your Command and the MEMS Team will continue to provide the best education in emergency management.

Cheating in this process will not be tolerated. If you are having difficulties please see the last page of this newsletter for contact information to request assistance..
